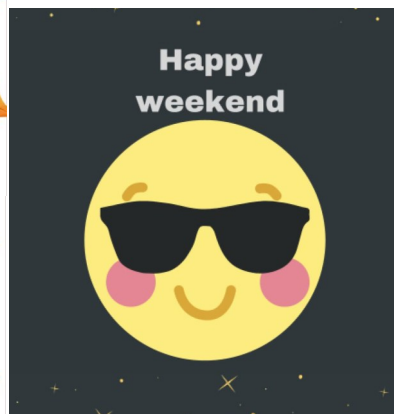

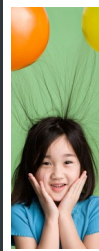


News from our classes
