This week in Bowland we have been super busy; in Year1&2 maths we have been learning about fractions. Reception have been looking at Small, Medium and Large, ordering objects in size order. In cooking this week, we have been prepping and cooking breaded vegetables, talking about why vegetables are good for our bodies. In PE, we have continued to learn old fashioned playground games working together to play them and teach each other.

### Grizedale

Grizedale have had a busy week this week! On Wednesday, we were joined by the Kendal recorder group who performed some brilliant songs for us using all different types of recorder. We also were able to perform some of the songs we had learnt to them which felt very special! This week we have worked as Scientists by asking questions and collecting data. We worked in pairs to learn about three different botanists and used what we had learnt to think of some different questions that we'd like to find out the answer to. We have also started learning about how and why Jewish people celebrate Shabbat each week.

This week we have continued to calculate with fractions and have been really proud of our progress. In science we have been learning about Galileo Gallilei and the impact of his findings. 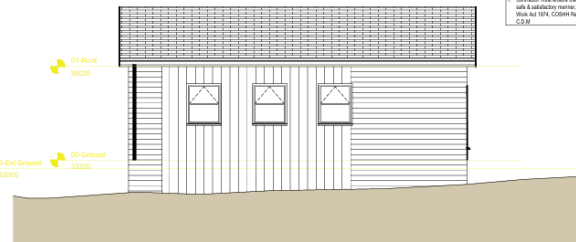

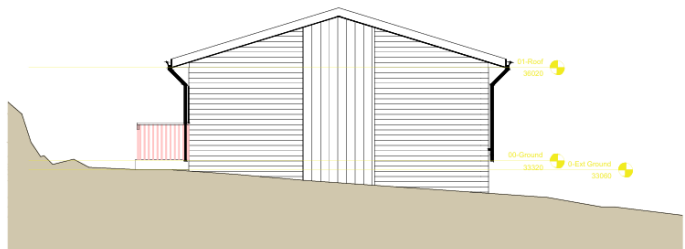
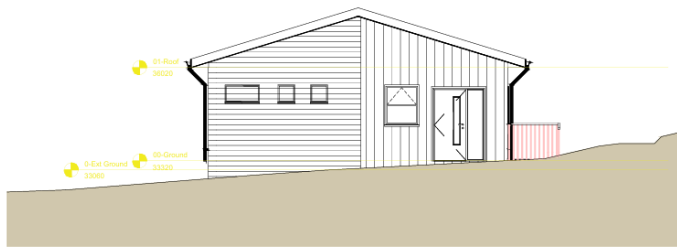


# Nicky Nook's New Classroom

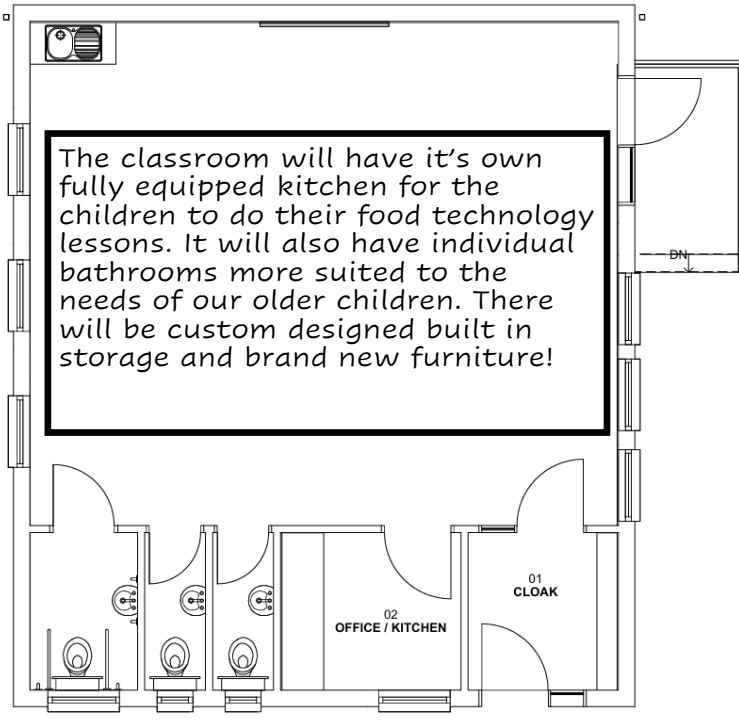
**Health & Safety Notes**

Our new classroom will allow us to move Grizedale Class into Nicky Nook's current room and we will be able to use our smallest room for interventions, meetings, music lessons, therapy sessions and assemblies. It will also become our breakfast and after school club room.



Our new classroom will be situated in the corner of the playground in front of the climbing wall which will be relocated. We will begin using the area at the front of school as part of our playground again, just as we did during COVID.



The classroom will have its own fully equipped kitchen for the children to do their food technology lessons. It will also have individual bathrooms more suited to the needs of our older children. There will be custom designed built in storage and brand new furniture!



The building will be cedar clad with a slate roof.
