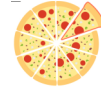


A message from Mrs. Scholz

This week in Art we have been collaging different human geographical features using maps of Scorton and tried to think about collage like colouring in using different sizes and shapes of paper. It challenged a few of us but we created some brilliant pieces of art in the end! In History, we explored the differences between the Mesolithic and Neolithic periods of the Stone Age and begun to think about which period we would have liked to have lived through. In Maths, we have been consolidating our learning on the properties of 2D shapes, including their names, sides, vertices, angles, parallel and perpendicular lines.

This week we have been cooking to explore reversible and irreversible changes in science. You can ask us all about them! We have created programs using micro:bits.
